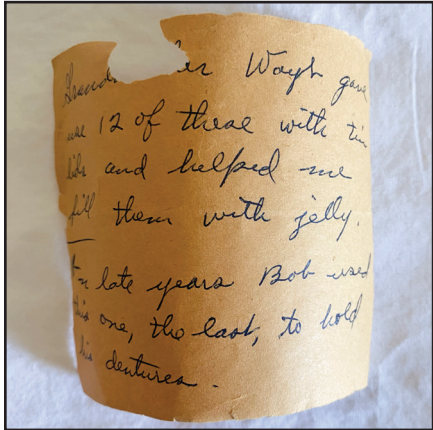

Ivory china with gilded trim. There is a set of 12 place settings: plates, bowls, saucers, salt & pepper shakers, and bowl with lid. They were purchased by LAS & AFS for \$50 in 1968 or 1969. Marked “Noritake”. None are broken, but are stored in different places.
